In the coming year, in addition to providing high quality trauma-informed services to our clients, WRC will be leaning into the housing-first model of care which focuses on helping survivors get into safe and stable housing as quickly as possible while providing ongoing wrap-around services to help them move forward with their lives.

Thank you to all of you who contributed to the successes outlined in this Annual Report. The accomplishments of this year would not have been possible without the incredible generosity of supporters and volunteers, who provided everything from critical program funding to donations of goods, clothing, diapers, and many other basic needs.

Program Highlights

24-HOUR CRISIS HOTLINE

4,464 calls from survivors and those helping them were answered by staff and trained volunteers who offered safety planning, support and informed resource referrals.

"I didn't know what to expect, but I'm so glad that I called. Right away, I was put into contact with someone who could support me, listen to me and help guide me through a very difficult situation."

EMERGENCY SHELTER

139 children, 131 women, and 3 men survivors were provided safe shelter, food, basic necessities, counseling, and case management services.

"When I arrived at the shelter, I was depressed, hurt and confused. Since I've been here, I have come so far. My fears have been replaced with hope and I know it is going to be okay."

TRANSITIONAL HOUSING

56 children and 32 women were housed in our transitional housing program that provides safety and security to survivors who are in need of housing as a result of domestic violence.

"This program has helped me provide a happy stable roof over my children's head while I worked on finding a job. I truly hope WRC continues to help others in need because without these services and guidance, I am not sure where my children or I would be today."

WALK-IN EMERGENCY SERVICES

1,558 emergency services were provided that included critical resources such as: food, diapers, hygiene products, clothing, referrals to other resources such as medical care and shelter/housing, and counseling.

"Thank you so much for your patience, persistence and help through this long journey. To have my freedom back is amazing. Thank you for clearing a path to a better future. This is such a relief and I am forever grateful."

PREVENTION AND EDUCATION OUTREACH

48 prevention and education outreach engagements were conducted in the community to provide reliable, up-to-date information and resources about domestic violence and sexual assault, including how to offer support to victims and survivors. We actively raise public awareness about the complex effects of domestic violence/sexual assault on individuals, children and communities.

54 community volunteers completed WRC's 52-hour Domestic Violence and Sexual Assault Crisis Intervention Training offered each quarter.

736 volunteers donated 14,421 hours of service in our THRIFT STORE, 24-HOUR HOTLINE, FUNDRAISING EVENTS, and SEXUAL ASSAULT RESPONSE TEAM ADVOCACY.

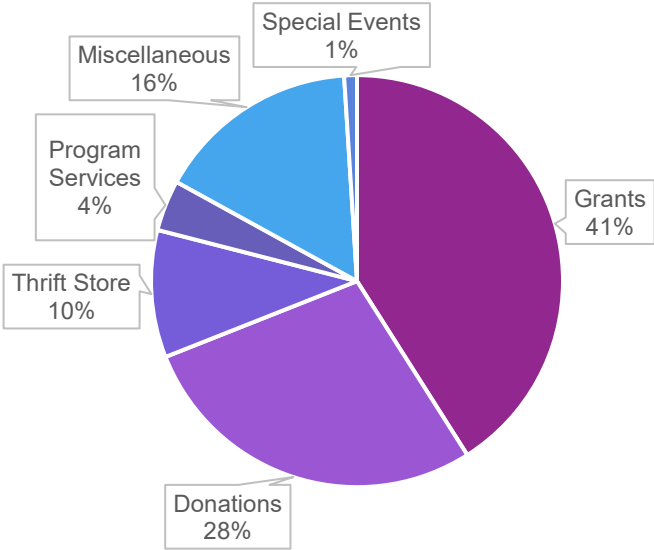

From Audited Financial Statements Year Ending June 30, 2021

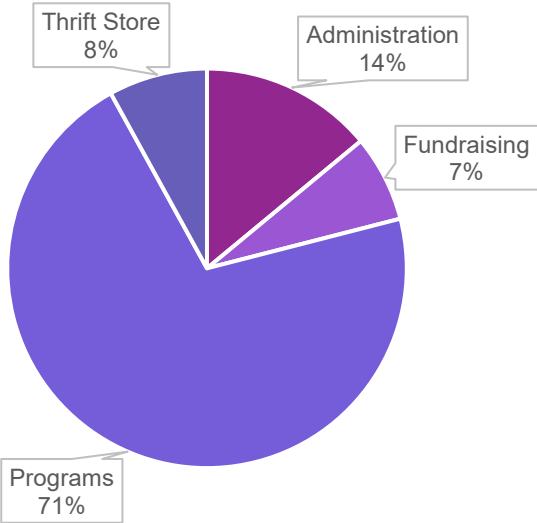
Income
